You may apply for as many scholarships as you wish, provided that you meet the eligibility criteria. However, to ensure that as many students as possible receive scholarship support; only one Foundation scholarship will be awarded per applicant.

Description: The Legacy Scholarship Program is a competitive scholarship program that provides graduating seniors of Mapleton Public Schools with financial support to further their educational and personal goals beyond high school. The Legacy Scholarship Program celebrates the uniqueness and potential of Mapleton's students by helping each and every promising recipient to achieve his or her dreams and contribute enthusiastically to his or her community and world. Legacy Scholarship amounts range from \$1,000 to \$2,000. Recipients of one-year scholarships may have an opportunity to apply for additional renewal funds the following year. At least one award may be reserved for a Legacy Transition Scholarship, pending applications received in that category. Legacy Scholarship application components are detailed below.

Eligibility:

Applicant must be a resident of Colorado and attend Mapleton Public Schools. Applicant must be eligible for and planning to attend an accredited college or university or other post-secondary educational institution in the next academic year.

Requirements:

Submit application form and all common application requirements (see application checklist).

Finalists for this scholarship will be required to participate in an interview process.

Additional Requirement: Submit a one-page (maximum) statement on how receiving a Mapleton Education Foundation Legacy Scholarship will help you achieve your dreams and contribute enthusiastically to your community and world.

2012 Scholarship Descriptions

LEGACY TRANSITION SCHOLARSHIP

Amount: \$1,000 (*under Legacy Scholarship Program*)

Number available: 3

Description: The Legacy Transition Scholarship is a competitive scholarship awarded to a Mapleton student with special or significant needs who intends to continue his or her education beyond the transition or high school program in which he or she is currently enrolled. The Legacy Transition Scholarship will provide much needed financial support for eligible applicants to attend innovative accredited programs beyond the Mapleton system that provide education and training to prepare these individuals to become independent, productive contributors to their communities.

Eligibility:

Applicant must be a resident of Colorado and attend Mapleton Public Schools.
Applicant must be eligible for and planning to attend an accredited college or university or other post-secondary educational institution in the next academic year.
Applicant must be identified by the Mapleton Public Schools Special Services Department as qualifying for the Legacy Transition Scholarship.

Requirements:

NOTE: The Legacy Transition Scholarship application form and requirements will be distributed through the district Special Services Department. Students must be identified by Special Services as being eligible for this scholarship award.

2012 Scholarship Descriptions

BACK ON TRACK SCHOLARSHIP

Amount: \$4,000 (\$2,000/year for 2 years)

Number available: 1

Description: The Back on Track Scholarship Program is a competitive scholarship program that provides graduating seniors with financial support to further their educational and personal goals beyond high school. Sponsored by Time to Change Community Corrections Program, the Back on Track Scholarship Program seeks to make a difference in the lives of scholarship recipients who have faced or are facing difficult challenges or circumstances (for example, students or students of families struggling with substance abuse, incarceration, probation, etc.). Priority consideration will be given to those applicants who have demonstrated perseverance and motivation in coping with adversity and shaping a positive vision for their future. Academic performance is NOT a consideration.

Eligibility:

Applicant must be a resident of Colorado and attend Mapleton Public Schools.
Applicant must be eligible for and planning to attend an accredited college or university, trade school, training program or other post-secondary educational or vocational institution in the next academic year.
Applicant must be able to describe how he or she has faced adversity and has demonstrated perseverance and motivation in overcoming adversity to create a positive vision for the future.

Requirements:

Submit application form and all common application requirements (see application checklist).
Finalists for this scholarship will be required to participate in an interview process.

Additional Requirement: Submit a two-page (maximum) written statement OR a video statement (4 minute maximum) describing how you have faced and coped with adversity, what you learned, your vision for where you want to be in the future and how this scholarship will assist you in getting there.
Applicants choosing to submit a video statement may also elect to include their financial statement (from common application requirements) in the video statement. All other common application requirements remain the same.

JOHN G. BYRD SCHOLARSHIP

Amount: \$1,500 (one year)

Number available: 2

Description: The John J. Byrd Athletic Scholarship Program is a competitive scholarship program honoring former teacher and Coach John Byrd. The John G. Byrd Athletic Scholarship provides financial support to graduating Mapleton student athletes.

Eligibility:

Applicant must be a resident of Colorado and attend Mapleton Public Schools.
Applicant must be eligible for and planning to attend an accredited college or university in the next academic year.
Applicant must be a Mapleton student athlete.

Requirements:

Submit application form and all common application requirements (see application checklist).
Finalists for this scholarship will be required to participate in an interview process.

Additional Requirement: Submit a one-page (maximum) statement on how athletics has affected/changed your life and how this scholarship will help you achieve your goals.

REGINA E. MATNEY TEACHING SCHOLARSHIP

Amount: \$1,500 (one year)

Number available: 1

Description: The Regina E. Matney Teaching Scholarship Program is a competitive scholarship program honoring the teaching career of Regina E. Matney, a former teacher at Valley View Elementary School. Mrs. Matney's love of teaching and her tireless commitment to elementary education and music education left an indelible mark on her students, colleagues and others whose lives she touched in her years in Mapleton. The Regina E. Matney Teaching Scholarship provides financial support to a graduating Mapleton student planning to enter a career in teaching.

Eligibility:

Applicant must be a resident of Colorado and attend Mapleton Public Schools.
Applicant must be eligible for and planning to attend an accredited college or university in the next academic year.
Applicant must be planning to enter the teaching profession.

Requirements:

Submit application form and all common application requirements (see application checklist).
Finalists for this scholarship will be required to participate in an interview process.

Additional Requirement: Submit a one-page (maximum) statement why you are interested in a career in teaching, what you hope to accomplish and how this scholarship will assist you in achieving your goal(s).

THE AUGUSTINE & TRINIDAD SANCHEZ TEACHING SCHOLARSHIP

Amount: \$1,000 (one year)

Number available: 1

Description: The Augustine & Trinidad Sanchez Teaching Scholarship Program is a competitive scholarship program honoring the lives of Augustine & Trinidad Sanchez and their commitment to hard work and education. The Augustine & Trinidad Sanchez Teaching Scholarship provides financial support to a graduating Mapleton student of Mexican or Mexican-American heritage who is planning to enter a career in teaching. Preference will be given to those students demonstrating financial need.

Eligibility:

Applicant must be a U.S. citizen.

Applicant must be a resident of Colorado and attend Mapleton Public Schools.

Applicant must be eligible for and planning to attend an accredited college or university in the next academic year.

Applicant must be planning to enter the teaching profession.

Applicant must be of Mexican or Mexican-American heritage.

Requirements:

Submit application form and all common application requirements (see application checklist).

Finalists for this scholarship will be required to participate in an interview process.

Additional Requirement: Submit a one-page (maximum) statement why you are interested in a career in teaching, what you hope to accomplish and how this scholarship will assist you in achieving your goal(s).

GLOBAL LEADERSHIP ACADEMY “ACHIEVE YOUR DREAMS” SCHOLARSHIP (Must be a Global Leadership Academy student to apply)

Amount: \$1,000 (one year)

Number available: 1

Description: The Global Leadership Academy Scholarship Program is a competitive scholarship program for any graduating senior from Global Leadership Academy planning to attend an accredited college, university or apprenticeship program in the next academic year. Scholarship monies awarded may go toward tuition, books, or other college/career related expenses.

Eligibility:

Applicant must be a graduating senior from Global Leadership Academy.
Applicant must be eligible for and planning to attend an accredited college/ university or apprenticeship program in the next academic year.

Requirements:

Submit application form and all common application requirements (see application checklist).

Finalists for this scholarship will be required to participate in an interview process comprised of 2 GLA staff and 2 external individuals.

Additional Requirement: Submit a one-page (maximum) statement on how Global Leadership Academy has influenced your personal and/or academic growth.

The recipient of the GLA Scholarship will be expected to make every attempt possible to participate in the interview process the following year to select the next GLA Scholar.

RG INSULATION “BUILDING AMERICA’S FUTURE” SCHOLARSHIP
(For students focused on a career in Engineering or Construction Management)

Amount: \$1,000 (one year)

Number available: 1

Description: The RG Insulation “Building America’s Future” Scholarship is a competitive scholarship program for any graduating senior from Mapleton Public Schools planning to attend an accredited college, university or apprenticeship program in the next academic year. Applicants must be interested in the study of Engineering Technology or Construction Management. Scholarship monies awarded may go toward tuition, books, or other college/career related expenses.

Eligibility:

Applicant must be a graduating senior from Mapleton Public Schools.

Applicant must be interested in pursuing a degree in Engineering or some aspect of Construction.

Applicant must be eligible for and planning to attend an accredited college/ university or apprenticeship program in the next academic year.

Requirements:

Submit application form and all common application requirements (see application checklist).

Finalists for this scholarship will be required to participate in an interview process.

Additional Requirement: Submit a one-page (maximum) statement focused on what inspired you to want to pursue a career in engineering, construction management, or another similar aspect.

A. FOX PHYSICAL THERAPY, P.C. SCHOLARSHIP

Amount: \$1,000.00

Number available: 1

Description:

The A. Fox Physical Therapy, P.C. scholarship program is a competitive scholarship program designed to financially assist a graduating Mapleton student to pursue an undergraduate degree in a field of study related to Physical Therapy as a prerequisite to a Doctorate program in Physical Therapy. (This undergraduate degree could be in the field of Exercise Science for example.) Physical Therapy is an entry-level Doctorate program where the student will apply after an undergraduate degree is obtained. The intent of this scholarship is ultimately for the student to become a Doctor of Physical Therapy.

Eligibility:

Applicant must be a resident of Colorado and a graduate of Mapleton Public Schools. Applicant must be eligible for and planning to attend an accredited college or university in the next academic year enrolled in such a degree as outlined above. Applicant must have a GPA of 3.5 or above.

Requirements:

Submit application form and all common requirements (see application checklist). Finalists for this scholarship will be required to participate in an interview process.

Additional Requirements: Submit a 1 page written statement on why and how you plan to become a Doctor of Physical Therapy and how this scholarship will help you achieve your goals.

The Frank Family “Energy and the Environment” Scholarship
(A scholarship dedicated to the use of energy efficiency for a sustainable world)

Amount: \$1,000 (one year)

Number available: 1

Description: The Frank Family “Energy and the Environment” Scholarship is for a student interested in engineering or environmental technologies. The Energy and the Environment Scholarship is a competitive scholarship program for any graduating senior from Mapleton Public Schools planning to attend an accredited college, university or apprenticeship program in the next academic year. Scholarship monies awarded may go toward tuition, books, or other college/career related expenses.

Eligibility:

Applicant must be a graduating senior from Mapleton Public Schools.

Applicant must be eligible for and planning to attend an accredited college/ university or apprenticeship program in the next academic year.

Applicant must be interested in studying Engineering Technology or Environmental Technology.

Requirements:

Submit application form and all common application requirements (see application checklist).

Finalists for this scholarship will be required to participate in an interview process.

Additional Requirement: Submit a one-page (maximum) statement discussing the importance of energy efficiency for a sustainable world.

Harris Family Beautiful Music Scholarship

Amount: \$1,500 (one year)

Number available: 1

Description: The Harris Family Scholarship is reserved for students pursuing a major in Music education, music performance or musical theatre.

Eligibility:

Applicant must be a graduating senior from Mapleton Public Schools.

Applicant must be eligible for and planning to attend an accredited college/ university or apprenticeship program in the next academic year.

Applicant must be a first year student majoring in Instrumental Music.

Student must have a 2.7 accumulative GPA.

Requirements:

Submit application form and all common application requirements (see application checklist).

Finalists for this scholarship will be required to participate in an interview process.

Additional Requirements:

Submit an essay (500 words or less) on why music is important for non-music majors.

Submit a short performance DVD displaying your musical talents.

YORK INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP
(Must be a York International student to apply)

Amount: \$1,000 (one year)

Number available: 1

Description: The York International Scholarship Program is a competitive scholarship program for any graduating senior from York International planning to attend an accredited college, university or apprenticeship program in the next academic year. Scholarship monies awarded may go toward tuition, books, or other college/career related expenses.

Eligibility:

Applicant must be a graduating senior from York International.

Applicant must be eligible for and planning to attend an accredited college/ university

Applicant must have unmet need in paying for college expenses.

NOTE: Applicants may have the opportunity to earn a Legacy scholarship AND the York International Scholarship.

Requirements:

Submit application form and all common application requirements (see application checklist).

Applicants must be very specific on the financial statement about how this scholarship can help meet unmet need.

Finalists for this scholarship will be required to participate in an interview process comprised of York staff and external individuals.

Additional Requirement: Submit a one-page (maximum) statement on how York International has influenced your personal and/or academic growth.

Applicant Requirement Checklist

Applicants should use this checklist to make sure that all instructions are followed and that application packets are complete. This checklist does not need to be turned in.

SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY

- I meet the eligibility criteria for the specific scholarship or scholarships for which I wish to be considered. (See scholarship descriptions for eligibility criteria.)

COMMON APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Each applicant **MUST** submit in one complete packet the following information:

- Completed, typed and signed** application, including **all requested attachments and essays for each scholarship for which you applied**. Please make sure your name appears on ALL application components.
- Resume. Submit the resume prepared for College Summit. Include volunteerism, community service, work history, honors and awards, etc.
- Personal statement. Submit the personal statement prepared for College Summit.
- Prepare a brief (not to exceed one page) financial statement outlining estimated annual program/tuition costs and a description of any special circumstances affecting finances that would help us in assessing your needs. Also include any scholarships you have already received.
- Two (2) letters of recommendation:
- One from a school or district employee
 - One from a community member who is **not** a school or district employee
- Most current official grade transcript, including SAT or ACT scores.
- Current color photograph of applicant paper clipped to your application packet

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- Additional scholarship-specific requirements/essays for the scholarship(s) for which the applicant wishes to be considered. (See scholarship descriptions for additional requirements).
- Finalists will be required to participate in an interview in March. Scholarships will be awarded in April 2012.

DEADLINE

- Applications are due to Mapleton Education Foundation Office located on the District Administration Building by **Friday, March 9, 2012 no later than 4:00 p.m.**

Success Tips for Applicants

While every scholarship offered by the Foundation has its own specific eligibility criteria and application requirements, there are things that you can do as an applicant for any scholarship program to make sure that you submit your strongest application. Here are a few things to keep in mind.

- ✓ **Follow instructions!** It is amazing how many applicants lose points (or are completely disqualified) just because they didn't follow instructions. Don't make that mistake! Read instructions carefully and if you have questions – ask!
- ✓ **Care about the overall presentation.** Strong applications follow all of the instructions, are typed and have been carefully proofed. Your application should be clean, neat, and well presented. First impressions count. Take the time to put your best foot forward!
- ✓ **Proof, proof, proof.** Don't just submit your first draft. Put it away for a day and read it again. Spell check doesn't do it all. Have someone else read over your application before you turn it in. Don't let typos and grammatical errors distract the reviewer from what you're trying to say.
- ✓ **Tell your story.** Make sure that the written materials that you submit – your personal statement and any scholarship essays – are well written, thoughtful, focused and clear. Make sure that you address what is being asked of you – and give examples to support what you are saying. This is your chance to shine as an individual and to tell your own individual story. What makes you unique and special? And don't forget to proof your writing!
- ✓ **It's not all about the grades.** Your academic history is only a part of what is taken into consideration. What is important to you? How do you spend your time? Do you work, volunteer, play sports, sing, dance or participate in clubs or other activities? Do you help out at home or are you active in something outside of school? Are you a leader? Have you won anything? What are you committed to? Use your resume and your written statements to tell the bigger picture.
- ✓ **Turn in your application on time!** You've got weeks to prepare. Don't wait until the last minute. It shows.
- ✓ **Be confident!** Everyone has a shot at a scholarship. It's up to you to present yourself in the best possible light. Take the time to prepare your application. Pick people for your letters of recommendation who really know you and can speak to your strengths. Your application is your time to shine. Take advantage of the opportunity!

The following rubric, used by the scholarship committee to review your application, can help you prepare the strongest possible application. While it is specific to the Legacy Scholarship Program, all of the Foundation’s scholarships are reviewed using similar scoring rubrics.
